Informational Presentation	Romi Uribe from the Dignity Health Oncology Clinic came to present about the new clinic and the services offered. Dr. Freeman is the physician and is very involved with the patients and their care. There is a good mix of experienced staff with new staff. Accepting referrals from providers.	
Public Health	Homeless Shelter on hold. Interviews next week for health education. Starting Jan 1, 2020 there are some new services providers can bill for; Rural Health Clinic, Federally Qualified Health Center and Indian Health Clinics can bill Medi-Cal for developmental screenings (\$59). Ask Michelle Schmidt if you need CPT codes. New surgeon general pushing childhood screenings. Provider portal to get CME from 2 hr training they can bill for ACES (\$29). Dept. of Social Services	As of January 1, 2020 DSS is going through Medi-Cal expansion to give full-	

	<p>scope to ages 19-25 who can't verify satisfactory immigration status. Tehama County has about 118 currently on restricted scope (emergency) that will expand to full-scope. Currently 4 CMSP in the county; missed reenrollment and don't have a change in circumstance. Flyer have gone out to spread the information and let people come in and apply.</p> <p>Kristine; what can they do to get clients the information? It can all be done online ww.c4yourself.com</p> <p>Transporters in the DSS office may be able to help CMSP clients get to doctor's appointments, job readiness. Suzanne had a client that was wheelchair bound and was unable to get Logisticare to transport and DSS doesn't have a wheelchair accessible van. Michelle questioned if it was actual fee-for-service Medi-Cal and not CMSP. Melissa asked them to contact again, they may just need more information. Greenville Rancheria has a DSS staff member to help them navigate the Medi-Cal process. Still waiting to know if DSS can hire a Medi-Cal Navigator in January.</p> <p>Staffing down about 12 members and makes it more difficult to manage the 10,000 Medi-Cal cases.</p>	<p>Melissa to bring brochures for all programs.</p>
<p>Dignity Health Connected Living</p>	<p>Tina brought Adopt-A-Senior cards and passed around.</p>	
<p>Dignity Health St. Elizabeth Community Hospital</p>	<p>Community meeting yesterday and the big topic was opioids and MAT program and expansion of the hospital. In the future the hospital will incorporate immediate MAT treatment in the ER. About 30 enrolled with either suboxone or vivitrol treatment and engaged with behavioral health.</p> <p>In Ohio they have had high opioid use. Lots of overdose brought to ER and they hired a recovered addict to work in the ER and they're able to successfully help patients. SECH discussing a possible grant to fund a mentor. Here meth is primary drug abused but the combination of meth and heroine with cannabis is rising. Stats for meth; over 55 yrs old are primary users. No specific treatment for that.</p>	

	<p>Dr. Shea will be at the Women's Clinic on Monday, December 16th and all OB providers will rotate through after that. Nurse Practitioners are already actively providing services, caseload at around 1,000 unique clients.</p> <p>Lassen Medical is currently not accepting new patients and patients who have not been seen in over a year are being considered new patients.</p> <p>A social work position will be posted to do integrated behavioral health services.</p> <p>Chiropractic and Acupuncture care is being discussed; number one reason people seek acupuncture is for pain relief. Helping to connect mind and body. Maybe acupuncture could be an independent contractor for all clinics to utilize.</p>	
Greenville Rancheria	<p>New mental health providers; NP treats children, family counseling; booked but taking referrals. Dr. Phillips, psychiatrist, has taken on new adult referrals. Pain Management also available. One Saturday available per month and hope to extend twice a month. Dr. Skipioni will come once a month. Native American drug and alcohol counselor. Two pediatricians are currently accepting applications.</p>	<p>Melanie to share information of new providers, specialties, and referral information.</p>
NCCDI	<p>Children's Christmas Festival on December 14th. Christmas gifts will be given to families. Wrap parties on Tuesday and Thursday from 4-6pm next week. Rolling Hills Clinic	<p>Pain Management is beyond capacity so information was removed from website. Some patients are being sent back to primary care and keeping most difficult patients. Hope to develop a program to expand if another</p>	

	<p>provider is willing. Nurse Practitioner will start women's health in Corning and hoping to start a FamilyPACT program. No OBGYN available in Corning. Diabetes care will start next year for the tribe and then expand to the community.</p>	
<p>Committee Reports Executive</p> <p>Dental</p> <p>Safe Sex After Fundamental Education</p>	<p>Moving orientation to February in hopes all new members will be in attendance. Will be reviewing bylaws today. Suzanne submitted her Ethics Certificate which she completed on 12/02/19.</p> <p>Lalani came to the last meeting to move forward. Will be working towards doing fluoride varnish done in the schools and hoping to have dental providers come to do at kindergarten registrations. Sharon mentioned in the past they didn't want them done at schools so it would be done at the provider office to get the connection made for a dental evaluation. February is children's oral health month and hoping to get dental providers out to schools during that time, not just Medi-Cal Dental providers.</p> <p>Salisbury students went to LIFT and were able to get documentation and clothes and they were pleased. Salisbury and REACH are planning a health fair for their students on Friday, April 3, 2020. Hoping to have community partners attend, Diana Geiger will be reaching out.</p> <p>MCAH state officials came to the MCAH regional meeting this week and we are the only county addressing adolescent health. They were impressed with the teen involvement and creation of health brochure and resource guide.</p> <p>All continuation high school kids in Red Bluff are caught up on HPV vaccination. This year will work with school nurse to get sex ed done in Juvenile Hall and get them seen at the Medical Clinic as part of reentry process to get caught up on vaccines and enrolled in FamilyPACT. Not able to get into Corning High School, Los Molinos or eLearning. Rolling Hills Clinic partnering with Corning High School to help with their medical program, teaching phlebotomy etc. Will work to make sure local hotels are</p>	

	compliant with human trafficking awareness training. Suzanne suggested we make sure human trafficking informational flyers with tear-offs are posted in bathroom stalls.
