<p>Old Business Salisbury Health Fair</p> <p>Teen Pregnancies</p>	<p>Teen Health Week is the same week as National Public Health Week. Diana attended the Parent Choice Conference on January 31st and was thrilled with how well they covered social/emotional topics. She was able to speak to a lot of organizations and get participants for vendors at the Salisbury High Health Fair. So far the following organizations are participating; Dept. of Social Services for Medi-Cal and CalFresh programs, Job Training Center, Tehama County Health Services Agency (Public Health, Behavioral Health, Medical Clinic), a local dental clinic, Police Activities League, Lifenet, Homeless Foster Youth, Community Action Agency and CHP. 	<p>relationship together.</p> <p>Syphilis is on the rise in younger age groups. In the past Public Health used to get 1-2 cases a year and now it is averaging 3 per week. This is especially concerning as there have been cases of congenital syphilis.</p>

Public Health will provide all the materials.</p> <p>Amanda mentioned they have playgroups for kids to do the preschool assessments and she thought it would be nice to be able to use that time to allow parents to take a break together. She also mentioned that it would be nice to provide a parent group for the parents of kids who are recently diagnosed with an IEP. She has noticed they have a difficult time accepting and coping with the fact that their child needs an IEP. Michelle added that she would love to have Public Health help with that but staffing is too low right now.
