Behavioral Health responded to the scene and met with TCSO on subsequent days. Please reach out if there is a need for additional mental health support.</li> <li>- Public Health's Oral Health Program is beginning a pilot program of Brush in the Box at Plum Valley and Rancho Tehama</li> <li>- The Oral Health Program is working on finalizing an MOU with a Registered Dental Hygienist that can work from school campuses to do sealants and make referrals for more in-depth care.</li> </ul>

This use is largely happening outside the hospital setting. The CDPH and SECH are offering to help set up a conference in the Coyne Center for healthcare providers to come discuss the importance of this issue and strategies for addressing this ongoing crisis.</li> </ul>

<b>St. Elizabeth Community Hospital</b>	Ruth Ann Rowen; HCC Coordinator & SECH EM Coordinator <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The hospital is busy with day-to-day illness and injuries, elevated numbers of everything, no one illness is disproportionately affecting the community</li> <li>- No resources for 5150 holds – the hospital is unable to refer psych patients appropriately due to no open beds and/or doctors available for new patients. Many spend extended stays in the ER.</li> <li>- Full Scale Active Shooter MCI Exercise on April 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> at RBHS – collaboration with RB Fire and SECH, TCHSA PH, TCSO, RBPB, TCFD and RBHS</li> <li>- Joint Commission and CDPH accreditation survey are finished – no significant findings</li> </ul>
